<p>Publishing Student Information The school newsletter and website provide a great opportunity for promoting the achievements of our students. Students love to see their photo in the newsletter or displayed around the school. However, to do this, the school needs permission to publish from the parent or caregiver. While 95% of families are happy for photos to be published, some parents and carers elect to withhold permission. The school or Department of Education may publish information about students for the purposes of sharing their experiences with other students and the broader community. This information may include your child's name, age and class, as well as information collected at school such as photographs, audio and video recordings of your child, your child's work and interactive media.
