



#### **Update on School Banking**

Attention Parents/Carers

On 24 October 2021, the Treasurer and Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning, the Hon. Sarah Mitchell MLC, <u>announced</u> that school banking programs will no longer be run in New South Wales schools from 2022.

School banking programs at Red Range Public School are arranged at a local level [via the schools' P&C Association/directly with the school]. With the upcoming cessation of the program, students will no longer be able to deposit savings through the school banking program at RRPS. You can still keep your child's bank account open and can continue to make deposits into your child's accounts through online transfer or at any bank branch. More information is available on the department's <a href="school banking website">school banking website</a> and Commonwealth Bank of Australia's school banking website.

The decision was made following the review of the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) <u>review on School Banking Programs</u> on 15 December 2020, which found that the costs of the program outweighed the benefits.

Financial literacy is embedded in the curriculum K-10. It is part of a continuum of learning in the work and enterprise learning across the curriculum content area from K-12. In Mathematics K–10, students develop knowledge, understanding and skills specifically related to financial literacy, such as money, financial transactions, pay rates, taxable income, rebates and levies.
